



JAXTRAX USER GUIDE

BEFORE USING JAXTRAX

Read this thoroughly before you install and use this product. Follow these instructions to ensure the highest level of safety for your dog. Deviating from the instructions may cause the system to not work properly or harm your dog.

Do not leave your dog unattended on the JAXTRAX for an extended period.

Ensure that there is enough slack on the lead, so that there is no pressure around the collar while your dog is lying down.

ABOUT JAXTRAX

Upgrade your mate from the screw in ground tethers, stake, tie-out and pen for an aerial track system on your next adventure.

Give them freedom to move, to sniff and to chill out without the tangled lead with JAXTRAX.

Great for camping, hiking, parks, fence-less yards and outdoor adventures when on lead is necessary, the portable JAXTRAX uses a unique zipline and carrier to provide your dogs with maximum range, mobility, and safety.

All dogs from the Little Mates to the Big Fellas will appreciate the JAXTRAX. This overhead system is totally portable, safe and rugged:

- Customisable track length up to 50m.
- Bright coloured lifeline rope for visibility
- Quick to set up in less than 10 minutes

See the difference in the secure roaming area versus the standard 6 ft leash:

- 30m tether 300 sq. m
- 15m tether 150 sq. m
- 2m lead on a stake 10 sq. m

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WHAT'S IN THE BAG

JAXTRAX comes with:

- 50m of 9mm lifeline rope
- 2x 2m Anchor straps with alloy pressed buckles and D-Rings
- 1x Anti-shock lead
 - 120cm-180cm
- 2x Rope Adjusters
- Breaking strength of 600 kgs

- 1x Carabiner (Black & Orange)
- 1x High strength aluminium carrier
- 1x Rope toy with high strength spring and carabiner
- 1x Waterproof carry bag
- 1x JAXTRAX user guide



STEP 1: CONFIGURE ACHOR POINT A

Select your anchor points

(such as trees or posts)
that are overhead and safely out of
the way of people and equipment.
Roll out the Rope between the
anchor points carefully. Tip: To
prevent kinks, do not uncoil from the
top. Unwind the rope the same way
that it was wound.

Any leftover rope will be stored in the bag and clipped to the line. Buckle the Anchor Strap around the tree, positioning the D-ring in line with the rope. **Pull it tight.**

Tip: If you are using a pole or post, wrap it around a few times so it doesn't slip down.

Attach a rope adjuster to the D-ring on the anchor strap.

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STEP 2: CONFIGURE ANCHOR POINT B



Select the next anchor point within rope length and buckle Anchor Strap B around the other tree or post, like in Step 1.

Space out the Rope between the two anchor points, if you haven't already done so.

Clip the other rope adjuster onto the D-ring of Anchor Strap B.

Warning: Take into consideration:

- safety,
- uneven terrain,
- garden equipment,
- · lead length,
- bicycles,
- foot traffic.

Note:

The anti-shock lead should reach the ground when set up.







STEP 3: THREAD ROPE AND ROPE LENGTH ADJUSTER

Thread the end of the Rope through the upper chamber of the Rope Adjuster at Anchor Point B and pull tight. Insert that same Rope end into the smooth side of the rope adjuster and pull the rope back into the teeth of the cam to secure it.





STEP 4: SECURE THE OTHER END



Insert the other rope end into the Rope Adjuster and pull the Rope back into the teeth to secure it. Pull the rope tight to tension the Rope.



STEP 5: ADD A LEASH FOR LATERAL MOVEMENT



Clip the Carrier to the line between the Rope Adjuster with the black & orange Carabiner.

Add the Anti-Shock Lead with the small end to the carabiner, with the dog clip hanging down.







STEP 6: **ADD THE PULL TOY FOR STIMULATION & FUN**



Toy comes with a tension spring for the energetic dog.

Hook the toy onto the rope with

its attached carabiner.



STEP 7: CHECK YOUR WORK

Your system should look like this.





STEP 8: SECURING THE LINE



The ease at which you can tighten or release the line can also represent a liability if you don't tie it off.

For extra security: Also loop the Rope end around the top of the line and back through the loop and pull it tight then tie it off.




STEP 9: INTRODUCE YOUR DOG TO THE JAXTRAX



Dogs are social pack animals. Help your dog understand that being on the JAXTRAX is a positive experience and is not a form of discipline. Walk up and down the track with your dog to allow them time to understand the sensation of a lead above. Your dog will require attention and praise to familiarise themselves on this system. Use positive reinforcement.

Make the end closest to the family a chill out area that is in the shade – including their favourite toy, bed, blanket, and accessible water Pick an area with shade, taking into account the sun throughout the day. Keep your dog on the JAXTRAX for a limited amount of time until they are accustomed. JAXTRAX is not designed to be a dog sitter.

Give plenty of praise and offer treats for good behaviour. Your dog when on JAXTRAX should always be in plain sight of their carer or owner. JAXTRAX has been designed for stimulation and freedom whilst still on lead. In time, your mate will thank you for JAXTRAX.





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
